#### **Overview:**

This activity is designed in order that students understand the different skills that individuals within a team require, and how each person plays a different part in achieving the overall goal.

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	Time	Activity
Introduction to Enterprise Education	10 mins	PowerPoint presentation to introduce Enterprise Education
Activity	1 hour 30 mins	Students are presented with a group challenge which could be a research study, group project or a live brief. The live brief can be real or just typical to the sector or industry.
		Students should identify the different types of roles required to deliver the project, and the skills that are needed e.g. team leader, communication, organised.
		This should then be developed into job roles with different responsibilities.
		The group should also think about the skills needed by the team as a whole.
		Groups will then present to the whole class the different roles and skills they have identified that are required to meet the challenge.
Evaluation	10 mins	Individuals should reflect on the skills analysis which was undertaken and how they were able to meet the challenge.
		What qualities are needed within the team?
		How can students develop their own skills in order to better face such challenges?
Session Review	10 mins	What skills do students feel have been developed through this session?
		Do students understand the importance of Enterprise Education?
		Can students identify ways in which Enterprise Education is already included in the modules?
		Can students identify Enterprising skills they have already developed from their modules?

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
